Subject: RF Compliance Program Update Letter – September 2026

NEW! PRC-029-1 effective date approaching on Oct. 1 – What to know

Bulk Electric System (BES) Inverter-Based Resources (IBRs) must be design and operation compliant with PRC-029-1 (Frequency and Voltage Ride-through Requirements for Inverter-based Resources) by Oct. 1, 2026. More specifically, based upon commercial operations date, please reference the following breakdown:

- BES IBRs in operation before April 1, 2025:
 - R1-R3 Design and R4 100% of units by Oct. 1, 2026
 - R1-R3 Operation must be met as DME capability becomes available (per the PRC-028 Implementation Plan)
- BES IBRs in operation after April 1, 2025, and on or before July 31, 2026
 - R1-R3 Design and Operation and R4 100% of units by Oct. 1, 2026
- BES IBRs in operation after July 31, 2026
 - R1-R3 Design and Operation and R4 100% compliant on Oct. 1, 2026, or commercial operations date
 - R4 is limited to those units in-service by Oct. 1, 2026.

Note: R4 Hardware exemption submittals (for facilities with a COD prior to the effective date of the standard) are due by Oct. 1, 2027, for BES and non-BES IBRs.

Additionally, NERC released the [ERO Enterprise CMEP Practice Guide: PRC-029-1 Enforcement Discretion](#) and [Enforcement Discretion Tracker](#). The purpose of this CMEP Practice Guide is to provide guidance to CMEP staff regarding the use of enforcement discretion for potential noncompliance with the design aspects of PRC-029-1 Requirements R1, R2, and R3 (Frequency and Voltage Ride-through Requirements for Inverter-based Generating Resources). Due to industry-wide constraints on qualified Inverter-Based Resource (IBR) original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) and vendors, some Generator Owners may be unable to complete the design implementation activities associated with Requirements R1 through R3 by the applicable compliance dates of October 1, 2026, for Bulk Electric System (BES) IBRs and January 1, 2027, for non-BES IBRs. NEW! NERC Announcement – Registration open for CIP Virtualization Standards Small Group Advisory Session

NERC, in collaboration with the Regional Entities, will host a Small Group Advisory Session (SGAS) for registered entities to discuss the revised CIP Standard Requirements and modified definitions addressing virtualization developed in Standard Drafting Project 2016-02. In addition to reviewing the changes to CIP Reliability Standards with mandatory compliance dates in 2028, the SGAS will also discuss early adoption, “per system capability” reporting, and industry questions.

The SGAS will consist of two parts:

1. **General Session Live Webinar** – A general session will be held to discuss revisions of the NERC CIP Reliability Standards addressing virtualization. **The general session will be held on Monday, December 7, 2026, from 1:00–3:00 p.m. Eastern.** Registration for a one-on-one session is not necessary to participate in this general session. 2. **SGAS One-on-One Sessions** – Closed, one-on-one discussions between a registered entity and ERO Enterprise (collectively NERC and Regional Entities) staff about issues pertinent to their compliance with the CIP Reliability Standards for virtualization. These sessions will occur between Tuesday, December 8, 2026 – Friday, December 11, 2026 and will be conducted virtually using Teams. **NERC will schedule the one-on-one sessions after registration is received and is coordinated with Regional Entity staff.** Please use the [link](#) to submit your request for a one-on-one session. Registration is free and is required **by **close of business, October 5, 2026**.**

Request for questions – To provide as much benefit as possible and address topics of concern from industry during the general session, **NERC is requesting industry submit any questions they may have relevant to the revised CIP Reliability Standards by **October 5, 2026**.** Please use the [link](#) to submit your questions, contact information, and categorization of questions (specific to CIP Standard or Requirement, Early Adoption/Implementation Plan, Per System Capability, Other). Multiple questions can be submitted in one request.

NEW! MSPP implementation update: NERC to open formal comment period

As part of the implementation phase of the [Modernization of Standards Processes and Procedures Initiative](#), NERC will open two 60-day formal comment periods, one on proposed revisions to the Rules of Procedure (ROP) and one on proposed revisions to the Standard Processes Manual (SPM). The comment periods will run through October 26. Revised drafts of the standing committee charters and the Reliability Issues Steering Committee’s Reliability Standard Development Subcommittee

scope document will be provided as supporting documents. A ballot period will also occur for revisions to the SPM.

Comments on the ROP and standing committee governance documents revisions are open to all stakeholders, and comments on the SPM are open to Registered Ballot Body (RBB) members, proxies, and contributors. **To vote on proposed SPM changes, you must first join the ballot pool by October 9.** The ballot pool will be open from **August 26–October 9**. Voting will be held from **October 16–26**.

NEW! Proposed retirement of ERO Enterprise CMEP Practice Guide: BES Cyber System Information

The ERO Enterprise (collectively NERC and Regional Entities) reviewed the [ERO Enterprise CMEP Practice Guide: BES Cyber System Information](#) (dated April 26, 2019). In reviewing the Practice Guide, the ERO Enterprise determined it is outdated due to CIP Reliability Standard revisions in CIP-004-7 and CIP-011-3 and no longer needed to provide guidance on retired Standards CIP-004-6 and CIP-011-2 (inactive on December 31, 2023). Revised CIP-004-7 and CIP-011-3 Reliability Standards became effective January 1, 2024, and clarified the CIP requirements related to BES Cyber System Information (BCSI) access, allowing for alternative methods, such as encryption, to be utilized in the protection of BCSI. NERC requests any stakeholder comments concerning the retirement of this guidance by September 14, 2026. IMPORTANT! NERC Registration and Certification Information

Notification of additional changes in registration status

Section 501.1.3.5 of NERC's Rules of Procedure requires the **registered entity to notify NERC through its corresponding Regional Entity of any changes in registration, ownership, corporate structure, or similar matters that affect the entity's responsibilities with respect to the Reliability Standards.** Failure to notify NERC through its corresponding Regional Entity will not relieve the registered entity from any responsibility to comply with the Reliability Standards or liability for any penalties or sanctions associated with failing to comply with such standards. **RF requests that registered entities provide RF Registration with 30-60 days advance notice of any such changes impacting NERC Registration.** Contact Beth Smail, Senior Analyst, Registration and Entity Services, with any questions at beth.smail@rfirst.org.

IMPORTANT! NERC Alert System Registration

NERC's Alert System is the tool used to disseminate information that is critical to ensuring the reliability of the BPS in North America. NERC distributes alerts broadly to owners, operators, and users of the BPS utilizing the listing of the NCR. Entities registered with NERC are required to provide and maintain up-to-date compliance and cyber security contacts.

Each registered entity identified in the NCR is required to notify NERC Alert of any corrections, revisions, deletions, changes in ownership, corporate structure, or similar matters that affect the registered entity's responsibilities with respect to the Reliability Standards.
